"Tell and come near; and consult together: Who has declared this from the beginning?"

"Surely, one will say: 'In the Lord are my justices and my dominion.'"

THE CANTICLE OF ZECHARIAH (BENEDICTUS) (LUKE 1:68-79)

For ourselves, that we may live as Easter people, bringing the good news of new life to those around us: we pray to you, O Lord.

Lord, hear us. Alleluia.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Let us pray as the Lord himself has taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us;

but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.
