For all who are dying, that they may face death with hope and peace: we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, have mercy.*

For the faithful departed, that they may come to the fullness of life: we pray to you, O Lord. *Lord, have mercy.*

#### THE LORD'S PRAYER

*Let us pray as the Lord himself has taught us:*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy name;  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread,  
and forgive us our trespasses  
as we forgive those who trespass against us;  
and lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,  
forever and ever. Amen.
