Nine Ways of Prayer of Saint Dominic

Prayer in the Body

The holy man bowed himself and prostrated on the ground, bending to the earth, and lay there long in prayer, calling on God with tears and groans, and often saying these words: Lord, have mercy on thy poor sinners, for what will become of sinners if thou be not merciful to them? And while he prayed he was seized with great compassion for sinners and unbelievers, for his prayer was always accompanied by great tenderness of heart. When he rose from this prayer, bowing profoundly, he adored the Lord, joining his hands, and bearing his body upright, showing reverence to God. Then on his knees, he bowed his body nine times in honor of the nine choirs of angels. And in this form of prostration was most fervent, and he taught his brethren that thus they ought to pray. He would make the sign of the cross before the holy image, and then prostrate himself, saying with groans and tears: The prayer of my body, the prayer of my heart, the prayer of all my powers — may it rise to you, O Lord. Let all my prayer be a living sacrifice, acceptable to you.
